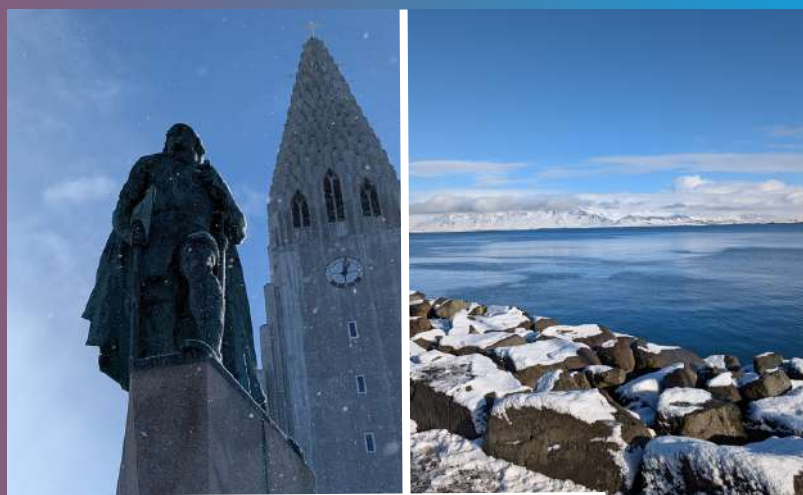
Main objective

VET-READY aims to create innovative educational tools that integrate disaster awareness and rescue skills into vocational training, benefiting both trainers and vulnerable adults.

Kick off Meeting in Reykjavik

The VET-READY project kicked off with its first meeting in Iceland, where the partners met to define the working strategy and kick-start the initiative. During the meeting, the main objectives, the distribution of responsibilities and the schedule of activities were discussed. In addition, the first key steps for the development of the different work packages were established, starting with the identification of training needs and the analysis of good practices in disaster education.

The partners also enjoyed free time together, marking the start of an international collaboration to improve resilience and emergency preparedness in vocational training.





Next steps

The consortium is currently working on WP2, which aims to map the needs of VET educators and adults in terms of disaster awareness and life-saving skills. This analysis will focus especially on vulnerable groups, such as migrants and people at risk of social exclusion. The findings from this work will serve as the foundation for the development of targeted educational resources and training modules in the next phases of the project.

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
