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Work Package 2 - Descriptive Disaster Awareness and Life-Saving Skills Mapping

The VET-READY consortium has successfully completed Work Package 2 (WP2), which focused on mapping disaster awareness and life-saving skills across Europe. This work included wide participation from our target groups — educators, adult learners, migrants, and diaspora — ensuring that project outcomes respond to real needs.

RESULTS

The Disaster Awareness and Life-Saving Skills Mapping Methodology and the Descriptive Mapping Report on Disaster Awareness and Life-Saving Skills are now available in English, Spanish, Latvian, Greek, Icelandic and Ukrainian on the project website.

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Findings and Achievements

The WP2 Mapping Report engaged a total of 545 participants across six partner countries:

- 155 VET educators
- 254 VET learners
- 136 diaspora members

Through surveys, focus groups, and desk research, partners identified 18 good practices in disaster education and life-saving skills, along with key challenges such as misinformation and gaps in legislation.

These findings provide a strong evidence base for the upcoming VET-READY Curriculum (WP3), ensuring it addresses real needs of educators, learners, migrants, and diaspora communities.









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Next Steps

Building on the findings of WP2, the consortium has started Work Package 3 – Disaster Preparedness and Life-Saving Skills Curriculum.

The curriculum will include 30 interactive training modules designed for VET learners, adult learners, diaspora, and educators ,focusing on practical life-saving skills, critical thinking, and resilience, helping both learners and educators to strengthen disaster preparedness and response capacity.

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
